Thyatira: More Tolerant Than God

Revelation 2:18-29 (ESV)

"And to the angel of the church in Thyatira write: 'The words of the Son of God, who has eyes like a flame of fire, and whose feet are like burnished bronze. 19 "I know your works, your love and faith and service and patient endurance, and that your latter works exceed the first. 20 But I have this against you, that you tolerate that woman lezebel, who calls herself a prophetess and is teaching and seducing my servants to practice sexual immorality and to eat food sacrificed to idols. 21 I gave her time to repent, but she refuses to repent of her sexual immorality. 22 Behold, I will throw her onto a sickbed, and those who commit adultery with her I will throw into great tribulation, unless they repent of her works, ²³ and I will strike her children dead. And all the churches will know that I am he who searches mind and heart, and I will give to each of you according to your works. 24 But to the rest of you in Thyatira, who do not hold this teaching, who have not learned what some call the deep things of Satan, to you I say, I do not lay on you any other burden. 25 Only hold fast what you have until I come. 26 The one who conquers and who keeps my works until the end, to him I will give authority over the nations, 27 and he will rule them with a rod of iron, as when earthen pots are broken in pieces, even as I myself have received authority from my Father. 28 And I will give him the morning star. 29 He who has an ear, let him hear what the Spirit says to the churches."

We are becoming more tolerant than God when:

I. We have redefined tolerance.

Traditional tolerance: Giving people freedom to have different beliefs and practices while at the same time allowing others the freedom to propose a different opinion or belief in humility and love.

Tolerance redefined: Everyone is right no matter what they believe or what they do and anyone who expresses a different viewpoint is seen as intolerant.

- A church that tolerates what God doesn't is a church in jeopardy of losing its power.
- As members of the church we have both <u>individual</u> responsibility for ourselves and a <u>corporate</u> responsibility for the other members of the body to be intolerant of sin.
- Are we tolerating things that Jesus doesn't tolerate?
- 2. We don't come under authority but we become the authority. (Revelation 2:18a)
 - lesus has the authority to define truth for the church.

Three things we can do with scripture:

- * Come under its authority.
- * Reject it.
- * Change it.
- We don't change the Bible; the Bible changes us.
- In the church, sometimes theological problems are just a cover for immorality.
- 3. We fear the wrong judgment. (Revelation 2:18b; Matthew 10:28; Proverbs 29:25)
 - Tolerating sin may not cost us anything in the present, but everything in eternity.
 - Whose judgment do we fear?
